What is SEPAC?

SEPAC stands for Special Education Parent Advisory Council.

The **Sevastopol Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SEPAC)** advocates for children with disabilities in our schools. The **SEPAC** also strives to provide information and support to the parents or guardians of those children. The **SEPAC** is an autonomous parent organization which collaborates with administrators and educators in our schools and functions in an advisory role relative to special education issues.

The **SEPAC** is comprised of individuals involved in, or concerned with, the education of students with disabilities. Membership is open to parents or guardians of students with disabilities, teachers, and administrators. Together, this group works to provide a supportive environment for students, families and educators that will help each student achieve their potential.

The **SEPAC** needs the support and participation of parents in order to remain viable. Please attend one of our meetings or contact us.

Parents often find their greatest support in other parents who are in a similar situation. **SEPAC** members work as a resource for others who are unfamiliar with regional services or are looking for information that might support the special needs of their child. **SEPAC** sponsors regular meetings where parents can learn from each other, gain awareness on pertinent issues, and find opportunities that will help build positive relationships with schools and community. Any **SEPAC** member will tell you, "We can't promise to have all the answers, but we are willing to work with you to help find the answers you need to make your child's educational experience the best it can be."

To carry out our mission SEPAC will:

- Support and encourage involvement of families of learners with disabilities in their school and educational programs.
